CALL FOR POSTERS

Rationality and irrationality in decision making: The role of intuition and emotion

30 June – 3 July 2008

Within the summer school on decision-processes organized by the Department of Psychology of the Catholic University of Milano, a symposium will take place. Such a symposium includes two main lectures followed by a discussion. A poster section on the topic “Rationality and irrationality in decision making: The role of intuition and emotion” is also included in the symposium.

The main issues addressed in the symposium are: To what extent human choices can be considered rational? Why a decision can be labelled as irrational? What is the adaptive value of rationality and irrationality? Is intuition a cognitive shortcut or a form of thinking which overcomes logic? When is emotion a limit and when it is a resource for decision?

Posters addressing such questions are welcome.
